The First-year Composition Committee (FYCC) met twice during the 2005-06 academic year. - •The total number of ESOL sections of First-year Composition was 8; the total number of students was 105.
- •The total number of sections of ON-LINE First-year Composition was 8; the total number of students was 110.
- •The total number of sections of Learning Communities combined sections was 5; the total number of students was 75.
- •The total number of sections of Honors First-year Composition was 15; the total number of students was 187.
- •The total number of sections in First-year Composition (including Honors sections) was 319; the total number of students was 6307.
- •The total number of first-semester composition students (ENGL 1101) was 2333; the total number of second-semester students (ENGL 1102, 1102M, 1050H, 1060H) was 3974. The total was 6307.

The average number of students per section of FYC during the year was:

•21.13/22 in regular sections (96% occupancy rate in classes limited to 22

students);

- •13.12/15 in ESOL sections (87.47% occupancy rate in classes limited to 15 students);
- •13.8/75 in ON-LINE sections (91.6% occupancy rate in classes limited to 15).
- •12.47/15 students in Honors First-year Composition (83% occupancy rate in classes limited to 15 students).

Our "occupancy rates" remain strong, which is a good thing for a program whose funding is now based on performance-based budgeting. We still have some difficulty filling classes at periods 08 and 09 and even late in the day on T/TH.
